Brief

Storage for large record collection. For the client be able to take the furniture with them if they moved. To have a likeness to the existing furniture.

Solution

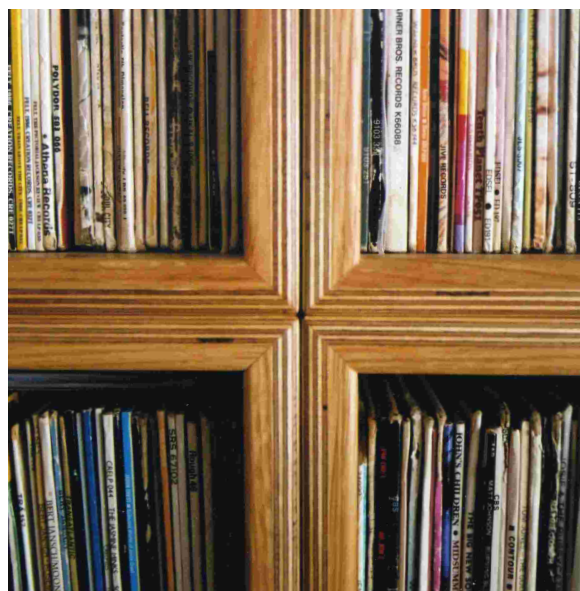
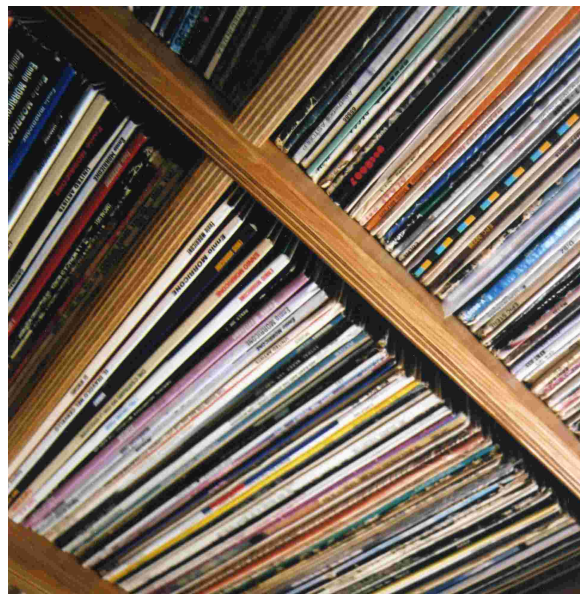
Modular boxes that stacked on top of one another, that could be dismantled to move. Putting the Oak inlay into the front edges, as they were to be permanently full of records and so that's really the only bit you can see.

Materials

Birch Plywood with solid Oak inlay.

Techniques

Mitre joints and a rebate on the front edge with Oak inlay.

Brief

To design a modular range of furniture.

Solution

Inspired by primary school "tidy-up" trays in both colour and function. The design aims at being adaptable to different storage needs. The versatility of the design allows the client to pick and choose components and colours without changing the basic modular unit.

Materials

Birch Plywood and coloured Laminate

Techniques

All the components are designed for CNC production. The corners have a lock mitre.

Brief

Contracted through architect to construct desks and screens for new office. Job needed a fast turn around.

Solution

Sub-contracted stainless-steel work and some of the labour in order to have the job ready in time.

Materials

Birch Plywood Desk with Maple lippings and Forbo Linoleum Desktop. Plywood screens with Forbo Linoleum Bulletin Board. Stainless steel stand and table legs.

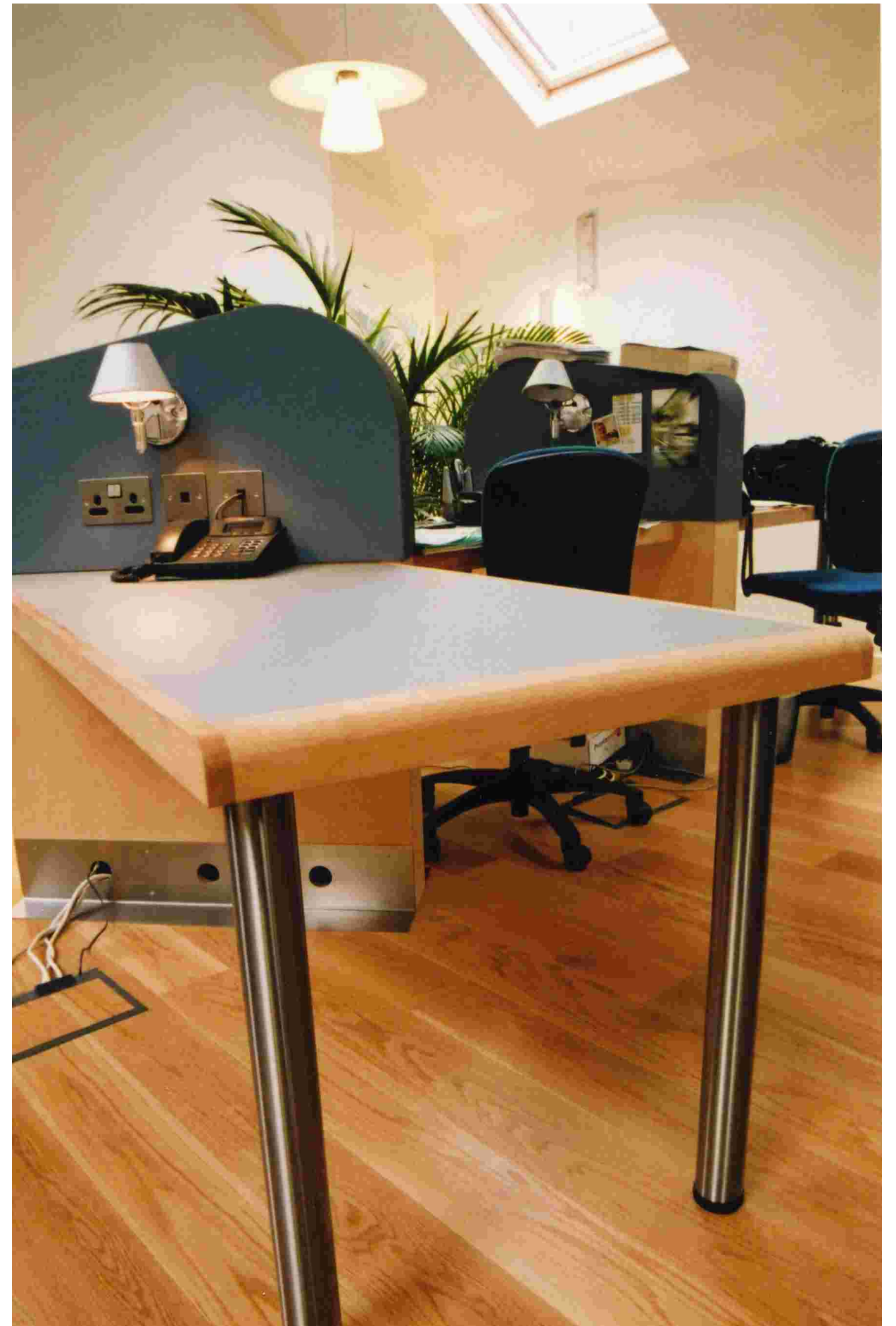
Techniques

Made nice work of the laminating on the Bulletin board where the 6mm routed edge hides the join of the 2 sheets of Linoleum.

Divan

Brief

A low level Divan (day bed) to fit into the bay window of terraced Georgian house. To match the contours of the bay as closely as possible. For it to cover a large portion of the floor but be movable and versatile as seating.

Solution

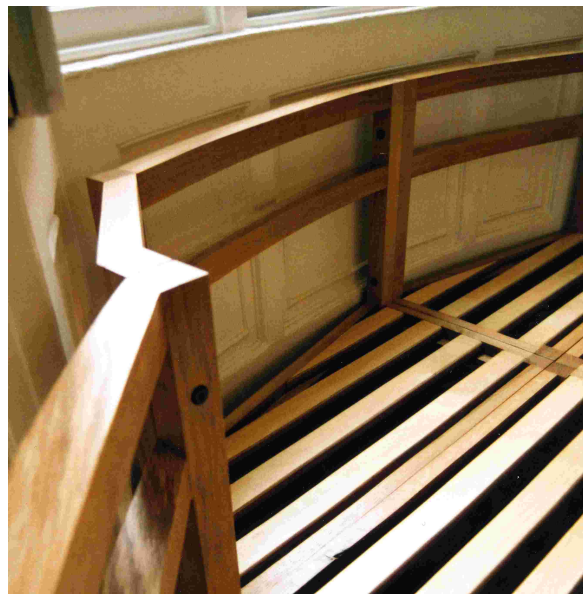
The Divan was made in sections, the front 4 were proportioned equally in size and could be readjusted for different seating/lying options.

Materials

Solid Oak framework and Plywood slats

Techniques

Made a template of the bay window in MDF, from which I took my final measurements. Mortise and Tenon jointed framework.

Teak Wardrobe

Brief

Fitted Wardrobe, the doors of which to have a wood veneer finish, the grain running horizontally.

Solution

Use thin Teak veneered boards book-matched horizontally and laminate them onto 18mm MDF with a Walnut detail between.

Materials

Teak Veneered Plywood, Walnut, MDF

Techniques

Laminating Plywood and MDF. Inlay of solid Walnut.
